It has been an exceptionally busy year thus far at Oaky North and the entire team continues to deliver outstanding performance across a number of key result areas. Most importantly, our safety performance has continued to stabilise as a result of an intentional back to basics approach to safety.

We undertook the industry safety stops for all personnel at Oaky North in August with 530 people participating in 9 sessions across two weeks. I was pleased that this session was treated with respect and we received honest feedback on how we can improve safety at our site.

Operationally the site continues to perform well with the Low Seam Longwall commencing operations in LW block 501, 6 weeks ahead of the budget set for this year. This result was possible thanks to the exceptional production performance delivered by the team during LW504 extraction and the early delivery of the Komatsu longwall well ahead of the budget delivery dates. This outcome has set our site up well for a good run to the line over the remainder of this year and is important for the future of the site as we transition to a low seam longwall operation.

Finally I attended the Tieri 200 Club Black Tie Ball in early August which was a great event for the community and an opportunity to raise some funds for a number of organisations that support the Tieri community. The event was well supported with tickets selling out and I would encourage anyone who hasn't yet been to get in early next year. I would like to extend my thanks to Lily McKelvie and Tanisha Hadley who planned and coordinated the event, their effort was evident on the night and the overall success of the evening.

Remember, the people we all work for are not onsite, they are at home.

As part of our commitment to progress responsible mining, the OCC E&C team works tirelessly to rehabilitate the land impacted by our mining operations.

In recognition of this, we have identified two areas of land that we are putting forward for Progressive Rehabilitation Certification (the industry-standard in land rehabilitation) from the Department of Environment & Science (DES): G5 South and Grasstree.

The proposed G5 South and Grasstree areas comprise approximately 120 hectares.

Mining work ceased on these areas by 2007. Since then, we have been performing monitoring of the rehabilitated landforms to confirm they are performing effectively.

To be awarded the certification, we need to demonstrate that the G5 South and Grasstree areas of land meet the four general rehabilitation goals set out by the DES:

1. **Safe** to humans and wildlife
2. **Non-polluting**
3. **Stable**
4. And able to **sustain** and support post-mining land use such as native vegetation, bushland or natural habitat.

As both areas of land were previously used for open-cut mining, we also need to demonstrate that they have been progressively formed and contoured to blend with the natural landscape and that suitable vegetation has been established. Any exposed coal seams must be covered; the sides of the cut must be battered to a safe angle or securely fenced and any depressions must be fully drained unless they are to be used for ponding of water.

The application process kicked off last month when members of the DES came to OCC to review the site and assess our rehabilitation efforts.

Based on their feedback, the team are now putting together all the necessary documentation for the formal application which will be submitted later this month. We are confident in our efforts to progressively and responsibly rehabilitate these lands and hope to be able to update you on the outcome of the application in the next edition of Tieri News.

Well baby Clinic – What is Child Health?

All mothers & babies are encouraged to call the center for a home visit after birth. Home visits are available to all newborns, then at 2 and 4 weeks of age.

Clinic at the Centre is held on a Tuesday and Friday by appointment only. Assessments are done on babies and children at birth 2, 4 & 6 weeks and then 4, 6, 9, 12 and 18 months of age. Assessments are then done between the age of 2 to 3 years and 4 to 5 years of age.

Hearing, vision and speech is strongly encouraged for children at 3, 4 and 5 years of age.

Neo Natal screening and Development assessments, advice about breastfeeding, formulas, post-natal care of mother and siblings, removal of clamps, heel prick, caesarean care, post-natal depression assessments, general care of the family unit.

Free Immunisation Clinic

1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month from 9am-10am. Immunisation is due at 6 weeks, 4, 6, 12 & 18 months and then 4 years of age. Your child is not adequately protected until they complete their 4 year old vaccinations.

Next vaccinations are at 13 and 15 years of age and 50 years of age. Parents are encouraged to take their child to an optometrist and dentist prior to commencing prep-school.
